K. CLOSING REMARKS BY BOARD MEMBERS

• Assemblyman Hennessey introduced legislation (A.8720) to eliminate the Gap Elimination Adjustment (GEA) rate for 2014-15 and thereafter and provide school districts with the full amount of aid generated by all existing budget funding formulas. Check to see if comparable bill in the Senate.

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- Suggestions were made for going "green" and reducing amount of paperwork
 - Scan supporting documents and articles for Board updates.
 - New website will have special area for Board log-ons.
- Overwhelming support for eliminating the GEA.
- Request for what hiring process is on future agendas.
- Standard operating procedures for communications. When teachers go out on leave and a sub is coming in, parents should know.
- Community support is needed for letter writing campaign to eliminate GEA. These are destructive government policies for Long Island Districts.
