Board member Barbara Schatzman recognized her neighbor Dieter Elihu Ruelas-Rojo, who is also a 6th grader in Bellport Middle School, for helping to rake leaves from her yard. Lori Klamut: spoke of the Dancing Classroom event at Frank P. Long School on Saturday, November 15th – said she was glad to see Mrs. Schatzman, Mrs. Huffine and Superintendent Walsh in attendance. Lori said that Pierre Dulaine, Director of the Dancing Classroom worked with 18 students who never danced before, teaching them "the social graces" of the Rumba, Salsa, Meringue, etc.; the event was a training event for the instructors. The dancing program will run for 10 weeks with students participating twice weekly; and on March 21st there will be an event to raise funds for the program. Lori said dancing teaches respect, which ties into Character Counts.

Gregory Miglino: said the district is fortunate to be able to "forge partnerships" with so many people in the village and the education foundation; spoke of how motivating it is to see and hear our musically talented students this evening.

John Frankie: with a report on sports:

- the Football team finished the season 7-3 this past Sunday; and lost a close game with West Islip;
- the Varsity Volleyball Team was ranked 3rd in Suffolk County with a 19-2 record; heartbreak to the Smithtown East;
- the Boys Cross-Country Team – freshman softball was 2nd in Suffolk County;
- Jose Milardi represented Bellport at the State race held at Sunken Meadow this year;
- Girls' Cross-Country Team was coached by first-year coach Dawn Farina; evolved as undefeated champs and sent Mellissa Del Rosario to State;
- starting to work on scholar athlete teams with GPAs over 4.0; a 4.29 GPA ranks third on this team – a 4.50 GPA ranks first
- Boys' Golf team has a new coach Jeff Johnson – each member of the team shared personal best;
- there was Middle School Dessert last Thursday night;
- Girls' Soccer team, lead by first year coach Sara Ecke – earned undefeated champs.

6. PRESENTATIONSPresentation
Autistic Prog.

Ann Marie Morreale, Director of Student Support Services, and Karen Mulcahey-Walsh, Director of the Long Island Development Center gave a presentation on the Autism Program.

An overview from Anne Marie Morreale:

South Country Central School District [SCCSD] serves 39 students with the classification of Autism. Based on the current enrollment of 4500 students, that is a ratio of 1:125. When students are diagnosed by the medical profession as having an Autism Spectrum Disorder, no matter how mild or severe, the Committee on Special, Education [CSE] assigns the classification of Autism. The individual strengths and needs of a student are considered by the CSE; based on these, the CSE makes recommendations for programs, services and levels of service as stated on the Individual Education Plans [IEP]. Our 36 students are placed in 12 different schools in 11 different programs:

- 1 – Residential
- 2 – NYS approved private school
- 9 – BOCES learning center
- 2 – BOCES district programs
- 22 – District programs
 - 1 – Resource Room
 - 13 – Co-taught integrated classes [inclusion]
 - 8 – Special classes

Mrs. Morreale shared a brief summary of amendments to the Laws and Regulations pertaining to required training in autism for applicants seeking certification:

On June 24, 2008 the Board of Regents adopted, by emergency action, an amendment to Part 80 of Commissioner's Regulations regarding requirements for certification....

Chapter 143 of the Laws of 2006 requires that all persons applying for a teaching certificate or a license as a special education teacher, in addition to all the other certification or licensing requirements, complete course work or training in the area of children with autism. The legislation further requires that the coursework or training be obtained from an institution or provider which has been approved by the Department to provide such coursework or training in the needs of children with autism.

Section 80-3.7 was amended and section 80-1.12 was added, to require that candidates for certificates in certain titles, who apply on or after September 2, 2009, complete at least three clock hours of coursework or training in the needs of students with autism from an approved provider. The applicable titles are:

- Students with Disabilities [all levels]
- Speech and Language Disabilities
- Deaf and hard of Hearing
- Blind or Visually Impaired

◇ Mrs. Morreale noted that more information on approved providers of training in

autism will be posted on the district website in the coming months.

Insight into SCCSD's 8:1:3 Autism Program:

In December of each year, Mrs. Morreale and Dr. Mann review the needs of 4 year-old preschoolers with a disability and begin the process of planning for appropriate placements for the following year. In December of 2006, it was determined that there were several children with autism that would be entering as kindergartners. A review and visit of our K and 1st graders with autism that were attending other programs was conducted and it was discovered that there were enough children to pilot a district-based program.

To shape the program, there were investigation and collaboration with a variety of professionals in the field of education and autism. During the 2007-2008 school year an 8:1:3 pilot program began with 6 students. In the 2008-2009 school year the district opened the program with 7 students, however, one student recently moved away. *Datafolio*, a New York State Alternative Assessment, is being used for student evaluation. Many services are provided directly in the classroom in order to enhance generalization of skills. The services provided are:

- Speech and Language Therapy
- Occupational Therapy and Consultation
- Physical therapy and consultation
- Behavioral Intervention Services
- Parent Counseling and Training
- Social Skills Group [daily]
- Sensory Integration
- Toilet training
- Autism Education Consultation [on site]
- Assistive Technology

◇ Plans are in place for integrating these students into the general education setting, when appropriate

Summary & Recommendations for the Needs Assessment of the Special Education Programs for students with Autism Spectrum Disorder within the South Country Central School District – presented by Karen Mulchany-Walsh, MS.Ed, BCBA , Director of Long Island Developmental Center.

The South Country 8:1:3 program was evaluated on June 6, 2008 and scored adequately in relation to the APQI [Autism Program Quality Indicators: created as a tool to monitor students] considering 2007-2008 was the pilot year of the program. As a result of the evaluation, it is recommended that the APQI is conducted every year to assist in facilitating evaluation of the ongoing program. Recommended also, is that student testing results is compared in order to demonstrate the program's effectiveness.

The following components are recommended to assist the programs so it can more efficiently address the needs of students with autism and provide a continuum of services for autistic students throughout the district:

1. *Appropriate Staff Identification, Staff Training and Support:* ongoing training in specified areas; individualized program development; quarterly staff meetings; common planning time weekly in order to facilitation of consistency in the implementation of protocols
2. *Behavioral Support:* have functional behavior assessment and behavior support plan on file for all students with autism; conduct routine behavior-based team meetings; identify who is responsible for creating, monitoring and implementing behavior plans; review behavior support plan for all transitioning students
3. *Social Skills:* investigate formalized curriculums and put in place, procedure for collecting data re: student progress; conduct building-level meetings to address plans for implementing training for nondisabled peers providing knowledge and support in relation to the disability in order to facilitate more meaningful interactions
4. *District-Wide Program Goal Development in Relation to the APQI:* SCCSD develop goals to assist in addressing the APQI deficit areas and support ongoing evaluation of the program

In addition to the evaluation percentages, presented also were the programs' strengths, weaknesses and suggested strategies for addressing deficits.

A: there are no perfect programs – however two districts come to mind: Sachem and Longwood for their continuum services; the State also publishes a list... Hauppauge and Three Village School Districts were mentioned as having excellent programs.

Q: is staff receiving all the tools necessary for success of the program?

A: Yes. But as we’ve discovered, additional tools are needed; whatever is requested is purchased

Request: Board member suggested a segment of Staff Development Day is set aside for autism training

Response: the Committee on Special Education has recognized this need and has put consultants in place.

Q: to the parents of autistic students in attendance: whether they are satisfied with the program?

Response: from Owen Durney: thanked Ann Marie Morreale for her presentation, and Mr. Walsh and the Board of Education for allowing him the opportunity to share the following comments, which he also distributed in printed form to each Board member and the superintendent of schools. [Excerpts from the handout]:

Mr. Durney opened by sharing a passage from Charles Kesler, a renowned political scientist, about government responsibility: he writes that he recently came across the passage again as it was used as an introduction to the Federalist Papers, and thought it would be appropriate to share with the Board this evening:

“Responsibility is the noun form of a much older word ‘responsible’, itself related to the verb ‘respond’, meaning to answer; its Latin ancestors is respondeo whose root (spondeo) means to promise sacredly or to vow. To be responsible thus means to be answerable to someone else, implying the possibility of punishment; but it also means to be the cause of something, to be equal to a challenge or obligation, to live up to a vow or solemn promise. If republican government is to be responsible it must be responsive to the people and answerable to their will, even if this course of conduct is not immediately popular.”

Mr. Durney writes, “Too often forgotten is that school districts are a form of republican government. The ‘people’ vote for the school board and the budget. The School Board’s responsibility, your obligation is to represent us, your constituents. Included in these obligations is the task of hiring the administration and the staff of the district who in turn serve the educational needs of the community’s most valuable

resource, our children..." Mr. Durney continued by speaking about the public's responsibility, and his as a parent. He spoke of the unimaginable suffering one endures as a parent of an autistic child; but also of the "joy, hope and optimism" that a parent "experiences when bringing a newborn into the world." Mr. and Mrs. Durney concluded with the following statement: [in excerpt]: the goal tonight is to work toward improving our child's educational experience and we are asking the Board of Education to take its responsibility for the autistic program, to be equal to the challenge and obligation that autism brings to this community, and to hold its staff accountable for providing the free and appropriate education that his child requires to reach his highest potential.

Q: How often and in what capacity are consultants working with teachers?

A: Consultants are working one day a month, responding to questions and dealing with issues.

Q: re: reading instructions?

A: the district is involved in a 90-minute-a-day program; this program will be individualized: 2 days a week for 30 minutes, depending on the student

Mr. Durney: personalized his discussions – referring to his son by name and the school he attends

Gregory Miglino: asked Mr. Durney to keep his comments general; and whether he wished to waive his right to privacy?

Mr. Durney: agreed to waive his right to privacy; said, in his opinion, the program did not address students' individual needs

Gregory Miglino: most district programs do not have a full time consultant on staff; the goal now is to continue to move forward.

Mr. Durney: said to date, he still has not received an annual or quarterly report on his child's progress.
