# BELLPORT HIGH SCHOOL - Press Release

School principal Nelson Briggs is proud to announce that on March 10, 2009 South Country and Connetquot School Districts will kick off a new program entitled the *Cultural Exchange Program*. This innovative program is already being implemented in Bay Shore, Kings Park and West Islip School Districts. It provides a way for high school students to challenge their own prejudices.

While Connetquot School District's demographics tend to be relatively uniform, South Country School District residents are diverse in race and ethnicity. Coordinators Alicia Ulberg, Assistant Principal and Lynette Murphy, Social Worker from Bellport High School and Cheryl Sosa, teacher from Connetquot High School will schedule select days of the school year. Students involved in the program will have an opportunity to "shadow" students from the opposing school for a day – learning that there are many more similarities among students than differences. Program participants will arrive as visitors at the other school and then be paired with an individual student from that school. The visiting student will spend a school day with a student in the other high school – attending all of that student's classes. At the end of each exchange day, students will come together to talk about their experiences. Coordinators will be on hand to guide discussion and assist students in exploring previous misconceptions they may have had and how these misleading notions have changed as a result of being part of the program. Participants will also be required to write a reaction paper outlining their experience of visiting the other school and meeting new people. Reaction papers from Bellport High School students will be shared with Connetquot students and vice versa.

*Cultural Exchange Days* will take place throughout the school year, giving students the opportunity to meet several students from the other community. The program will be a long-term project with students who participate also being part of a greater peer leadership program.

*Michael Bilecki*: complimented the décor of the new boardroom; Q re: cost for the new furniture and overall costs?

*Gregory Miglino*: actual cost is not presently known; the size of the Board table is larger than what was ordered, the Board was unaware of the size; cost for the PA system is estimated around \$32 thousand;

*Michael Bilecki*: Q re: status of Huffine vs. the Board of Education? Q re: total cost to date?

*Gregory Miglino*: this is an ongoing matter; we are at the \$50 thousand mark. *Toni Huffine*: there are still 5 more witnesses for the Board to present; and 5 more witnesses for my side to present

*Michael Bilecki:* mentioned an article in the paper about cost for the SCSD's legal matters...

Gregory Miglino: The printed articles about the cost were inaccurate...

*Maureen LaRocca*: [Kreamer Street School]: said she has no knowledge of Huffine vs. the Board of Education..?

Gregory Miglino: provide Maureen La Rocca with an overview of the legal action. Resident - on Behalf of Carlos Malave: [name unclear]: addressed the Board about a matter concerning a coach who uses profanity to address members of the Girls' Track Team; said these concerns have been addressed with John Frankie but nothing has been done.

*Gregory Miglino*: the superintendent has knowledge of this issue and it will be addressed; told the residents he will arrange for a meeting with them and the superintendent

*Susan Roth*: spoke of busing for the next school year; voiced concerns about benefits and job retention for bus employees; mentioned contractual practices in other districts; requested of the Board, an update on their plans for bidding out busing.

*Gregory Miglino*: the Board has engaged a law firm to review the legalities; they are developing a prospectus and it appears that only a percentage of the employees can be retained; said, if it were up to him, all bus employees would be retained; spoke of saving money and maintaining tax stability; said goals can only be realized by cutting waste, and that the biding process is scheduled for the first week in February 2009.

*Jackie*: discussion re: her attempts to meet with the high school coaches to register complaints of the use of inappropriate language when addressing members of the Girls' Track Team.

*Gregory Miglino*: because this is a personnel issue, the Superintendent of Schools will address this matter; you will also be hearing from Athletic Director, John Frankie

*Erika Watson*: [FPL]: addressed the Board with her concerns pertaining to the "abrupt dismissal of a long-term employee" in her building; said the employee's dismissal is affecting the morale of staff members

*Gregory Miglino*: the building principal makes the decision to terminate; said he hopes that morale does not continue to be affected.

*Toni Huffine*: acknowledged that she has received an email message pertaining to the dismissal; assured Erika Watson that the Board will be "taking this matter under discussion"

# 8. PRESENTATION

Bellport High School Principal Nelson Briggs, and Assistant Principal Bernie Soete gave a presentation on changes to the Curriculum Handbook and highlights of new courses that will be offered for the 2009-2010 school year.

### **Reason for Changes**

Mr. Briggs notes, "In an effort to align curriculum, course description, and course titles with New York State Learning standards and, perhaps more importantly, what colleges are looking for in prospective students, the 2008-2009 curriculum handbook was reviewed by teachers and administrators" as a committee, "to see what changes could be made to the current product."

### The "Name" Change

Beginning with the 2009-2010 school year, the 2008-2009 Curriculum Handbook will undergo a name-change. The handbook will now be called a "Course Selection Guide" According to Mr. Biggs, the title of the handbook

Presentation [Course Selection Guide] was changed because it does not provide curriculum to students, only descriptions of courses from which students may choose.

# What's New in the Course Selection Guide:

- A cover designed by students in the Art department
- A letter from the principal highlighting the importance of the course selection process
- A table of contents
- Numbered pages
- Colored graphics
- Learning standards outlined for each department
- Course offering by grade level
- Course description that now include course number, grade level, length of course, credit value, and any pre/co-requisites that may be required
- ESL, Reading, and Special Education each has its own department page
- Elimination of information, as provided by guidance [i.e.: NCAA eligibility requirements]

# **Guidance Section**

 The Guidance & Counseling center now list services it provides, by grade Level; a *Definition of Terms* has been added; graduation requirements has been redefined and reformatted; and a discussion of program levels has been added

### **Program Changes**

College Credit through Senior Classes has been added to outline how students may earn college credits while still in high school

*S.C.A.L.E. Program* [Secondary Collegiate Articulated Learning Experience]: This program is being revisited.

*University in the High School* [Farmingdale State College]: this program will be expanded to include more math and business courses

*Excelsior Program* [Suffolk Community College]: this program is **new** and is being proposed in four [4] English classes

*College Entrance Exams*: BHS is exploring the prospect of becoming an ACT school for 2009-2010.

A *Special Programs* section was included to mention the AIS [Academic Intervention Services] program, AEP [Alternative Education Program], and Library Media Center

#### **Courses by Name**

ART: some courses were renamed; others were reintroduced under a new name; and new courses were added

BUSINESS: some courses were renamed; and others were reintroduced

ENGLISH: many course descriptions were rewritten; 'married' courses were

split [i.e.: Creative Writing/Science Fiction – students could now take one elective without taking the other]; courses were renamed or reintroduced; and other courses were revamped.

Presentation -Course Selection Guide [Cont'd]

HEALTH/PHYSICAL EDUCATION: all student activities are listed

*MATHETATICS*: many course descriptions were rewritten, others were renamed; some courses were revamped; and courses were added to the selection guide

*MUSIC*: Music Theory & Literature was reintroduced; and the selection guide now differentiates between credit-bearing classes and chamber ensemble.

*SCIENCE*: many course descriptions were rewritten; and others were renamed; new courses were offered, including non-Regents Chemistry and Physics; Sports Medicine and Ornithology courses were eliminated.

*SOCIAL STUDIES*: many course descriptions were rewritten; others were renamed; and new courses such as Honors Global 10 and Honors U.S. History 11are offered

SPECIAL EDUCATION: program descriptions were provided to clarify any confusion

#### **Summary**

Courses were renamed to ensure alignment with what colleges and the NCAA are seeking. In some cases, courses were renamed because their titles were too long. Honors classes were introduced in some disciplines where they previously did not exist. Additional AP classes were also added. It is the goal of the administration and teachers of Bellport High School to continue to provide its students with courses and curricula that will be academically challenging, and the resources necessary for their future success.

According to Mr. Briggs, the curriculum handbook review was a "collaborative effort between teachers and administrators. The intention was not to dismantle its content, but to 'clean up' and 'refresh' its content and appearance. The 2009-2010 Course Selection Guide follows a more uniformed format. Information that may be of little importance to students were removed and replaced with that of more importance." Mr. Briggs stated that with the hopes of strengthening working relationships with parents and students, they are undertaking steps to empower guidance counselors in the decision-making process, as they move into the implementation stage of the guidance plan.

Nelson Briggs and Bernie Soete: Discussion re: the Perkins Grant and the first meeting of the Advisory Board tomorrow, 1/15/2009 – Sheila Smith is the Coordinator of the program. The goal of the advisory Board is to provide internships for students through Brookhaven Lab. Next year if all goes as planned, the Advisory Board will enter into Phase II of the program. In this phase, job opportunities will be provided to students.

# **Q & A: Presenters and Board Members**

Q: [Toni Huffine] - is the Visionary Committee connected with the Advisory Board?

*A*: No.

Q: [Kevin Kirk] - number of new classes offered this year?

A: eight to ten; but in combination with last year's classes

Q: [Marian McKenna] - requirements? believes students do not take AP classes seriously and therefore refuse to take the AP exams.

A: students fail to take AP exams because some feel pressured

Statement: Superintendent Walsh: courses are not only be renamed, they are being refined as well.

*Statement*: Carl Moodt thanked Mr. Briggs for making the college application process easier.

Statement: Toni Huffine thanked Mr. Briggs and administrators for their hard work, and for their decision not to print a handbook for every student. Continued Discussion re: cost for courses, including costs in the budget; and possibly using shared services.

Board President Gregory Miglino urged Board members to carefully review the calendar to ensure conflicts that were encountered last school years are not repeated.
